

Anyone, including trustees, with a controlling interest, at least 25%, in a corporation or corporate-like entity will be responsible for filing with FinCEN. Penalties start at \$500/day and filing requirements begin on January 1, 2024.

net worth individuals and families, corporate trustees, and private professional fiduciaries.


Matt has successfully handled numerous trials and arbitrations of trust and estate disputes. He has also handled many appeals, including the following cases that resulted in published opinions:
